

Title: What Is God The Son – Part 3 – Death and Resurrection

Scripture: Mark 10:45; 1 Corinthians 15:3-4

For even the Son of Man did not come to be served, but to serve, and to give His life – a ransom for many. – Mark 10:45

I want to clarify for you the gospel . . . that Christ died for our sins according to the Scriptures, was buried, and was raised on the third day according to the Scriptures . . . – 1 Corinthians 15:1, 3-4

We might say the whole message of the Bible comes down to the death and resurrection of Christ.

Five Words on the Results of the Cross

1. *Substitution* – Jesus died a substitutionary death on behalf of sinners. Isaiah 53; 1 Peter 2:24, Mark 10:45
2. *Redemption* – Christ purchased us out of the slave market of sin and set us free. 1 Corinthians 6:20
3. *Propitiation* – The payment met in full the holy standard of God. Romans 3:25
4. *Forgiveness* – Christ's death provided the legal means whereby God could forgive sin. Our debt of sin was nailed to the cross. Colossians 2:13-14
5. *Justification* – This is also a legal action which God the Judge declares the believing sinner righteous. Romans 5:1

But as for me, I will never boast about anything except the cross of our Lord Jesus Christ . . . – Galatians 6:14

What the Resurrection Means:

1. It validates the Christian faith. Romans 1:4; 1 Corinthians 15:17
2. It shows the Father's acceptance of the Son's work.
3. It fulfilled prophecies making God's word true once again and showing His power to declare the future. Psalm 16:10; Matthew 16:21.

What does it mean to me in 2009?

1. I am loved.
2. I am in serious trouble if I am trusting in something other than the cross for salvation, forgiveness, or the ability to live as God calls me to.
3. I should conduct my life according to what was done for my life.
4. I should see sin as in the way of everything good in life.
