The Father is recognized as God

Jesus Christ is recognized as God

Thomas responded to Him [Jesus], “My Lord and my God.” - John 20:28

The Holy Spirit is recognized as God

. . . why has Satan filled your heart to lie to the Holy Spirit . . . you have not lied to men, but to God. – Acts 5:3-4

Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit . . . – Matthews 28:19

Each one is not a portion of God, but the complete fullness of God.

A Definition:

There is one only and true God, but in the unity of the Godhead there are three coeternal and coequal Persons, the same in substance, but distinct in subsistence. – B.B. Warfield

Some ideas on the Trinity:

1. The Trinity is proof we can spend all of eternity seeking to understand the many facets and complexities of our God and still not completely know all there is. He is both knowable and incomprehensible at the same time.
2. The Trinity is eternal. There has always been a Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. Every attribute we looked at about God is equally and fully true of the Father, of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.
3. We can and should pray to God in general, and to each member of the Trinity.
4. We should seek to know, worship, and serve all three members of the Trinity; knowing we are serving but one God.
